

ABSTRACT

Resilience is the ability of individuals to face, overcome, and rise from difficulties, particularly in the context of children in conflict with the law. This study aims to provide a general overview of: 1) the characteristics of the respondents, 2) external support (I Have) for children in conflict with the law, 3) personal strengths (I Am) of children in conflict with the law, and 4) interpersonal skills and problem-solving abilities (I Can) of children in conflict with the law. This research employs a quantitative approach with a descriptive method. The sample for this study consists of 30 respondents selected using purposive sampling techniques. Data collection methods used include: 1) questionnaires, and 2) documentation studies. The validity of the measurement tools was tested using face validity, and reliability was assessed using Cronbach's alpha. The results of this study indicate that the level of resilience among children in conflict with the law at Sentra Antasena in Magelang falls into the good category, with the external support aspect (I Have) scoring 1.617, the personal strengths aspect (I Am) scoring 868, and the interpersonal skills and problem-solving abilities aspect (I Can) scoring 484. Based on the research findings, the researcher proposes a program titled "Reinforcement Resilience of Children in Conflict with the Law Through Self Help Groups" at Sentra Antasena in Magelang. The objective of this program is to improve the resilience of children in conflict with the law at Sentra Antasena in Magelang.
